

Mission Update

1 Timothy 1:1-2

In Paul's case the word "apostle" (v1) defined his vocational and recognised office. The original Greek term for the



word however simply means "the one who is sent out". And this is something that we all are: sent out, just like ambassadors, to represent the country we belong to. We are called to be the link between our fellow men and our King, Christ Jesus.

As North East Scotland Youth For Christ we seek to be specifically the link between young people and Jesus. Our aim is to take the good news of Jesus relevantly to every that the gospel is relevant. That must not change. But we can and often must change the way and the context in which we present that always relevant gospel.

We want to support & encourage churches in the North East to:

- watering it down or changing it and to
- Seek new and improved ways to reach the local young people with that Gospel.

We pray for "true [children] in the faith" (v2) all over the North East, that they may know the "grace, mercy, and peace from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Lord." (v2)

Update on our vision

1) Hubs:

We want to train, resource and support churches more effectively all over the North East of Scotland

We are looking to develop hubs all over the North East so any youth worker training & resourcing is more accessible locally.

The idea would be that each hub would have at least one meeting a year with about 5-10 of the local churches represented where they would receive training and support.

In the long term we would love to see these hubs also working **New CoR members** to organise local inter-church missions.

2) Mission Teams:

We want to equip churches to reach young people locally and give opportunities to see their young people grow in their faith Looking at our pool of volunteers we have found the exciting opportunity to have 3 outreach teams, using specific gifts: music, sports and a third category that may include things like events, detached work, technology and drama (basically everything else!).

We are not yet sure what these teams would look like because we strongly believe that it should come from those young person in North East Scotland. We firmly believe specifically in them. That is why we have spent the last wee while identifying key players for those teams.

> These teams would be essentially opportunities for young people to serve using their gifts in an inter-denominational context to reach out to other young people.
