IN SCHOOL GROUPS

Five-a-Side Football

Riverbank five-a-side football continues to meet every Thursday at 3pm after school, with a group of around 15 P5-P7 kids coming along. This group is purely relational with no set talks and is just somewhere for the kids to come have some fun and exercise. It has been great to get to know the kids and build good relationships with them. It has also been encouraging to see a lot of them coming along to, and engaging well in, other groups such as Radiate and Riverbank SU.

Riverbank SU

Riverbank SU runs each week on a Thursday in Riverbank Primary School with 15 - 35 kids attending each week. We are currently looking at Acts and the lives of the apostles. The kids engage really well and the way they answer questions and recite memory verses is very encouraging. We do however need additional volunteers to help run the group effectively.

Northfield Academy SU

Northfield Academy SU meets each week on a Friday lunchtime in the school with around 10 - 15 young people regularly attending. We play board games and have a short talk, based around big questions from the Bible, e.g., 'Who is Jesus', 'What is Sin'; 'What is the Holy Spirit' etc., at each session. We have been very encouraged with the level of engagement the young people have with the talks and the guestions they ask.

OUT OF SCHOOLS GROUPS

Radiate

The format and entrance age (now P3-P7) of Radiate, situation. our weekly kids club, has been changed and we have been really encouraged to see attendance numbers grow to 20+ kids attending and engaging really well each week.

We have been going through some of Luke's Gospel and various moments in the life of Christ, finishing with his death and resurrection. This series has given rise to some questions from the kids, such as "What is sin?": "How can Jesus' death mean that we can be forgiven?" etc. There is also space for the kids to raise life issues and any other questions which they may have.

Illuminate

7:15pm, with a typical session starting with tea/coffee and some food, moving on to games and then into a time of Bible study, the session finishing in a relaxed manner with chat space for young people to raise any life issues and questions they wish.

We have had a very steady past few months with around 10-15 young people from S1 to S3 coming along. We

have been very encouraged to see the same voung people coming along each week. eager to learn and eager to grow. We look forward to how Illuminate will develop as we go through the new term.

Friday Night Youth Drop-In

Friday Night Youth Drop-In has been a challenge over the past months with a sharp drop in numbers of young people attending.

This has been a matter of prayer for us and we are continuing to seek the Lord for quidance as to our options including whether to keep the Drop-In running or better use our resources elsewhere. young 📕 people who do currently attend

are involved in other groups such as Illuminate so if we been maintained and we pray and trust that these will were to stop the Drop-In, we would still have contact with them. We would appreciate your prayers over this

One-to-One Support

Our team of 4 volunteers continue to meet regularly with around 10 young people for one-to-one support sessions. This gives the young people, many of whom come from chaotic and dysfunctional backgrounds, the opportunity to relax, have fun and chat about stuff that's going on in their personal lives or at school. It is also an opportunity for those

Illuminate (S1 - S3) meets on a Wednesday night at young people who are Christians to have discipleship and fellowship with an older Christian.

PANNA Cage Football

The Cage football season got off to a brilliant start and we have run the Cage several times now since the summer began with around 25 young people out at the sessions. It continues to be a great opportunity to mingle with kids and voung people, get to know them and build

> relationships and has also led to some good conversations with parents who come along to support their kids. Unfortunately the wet weather over the summer has hindered Cage use, however we are hoping to get a few more sessions in before we stop for the winter.



The Tillydrone Summer Mission/Community Week was held 10 to 14 July in partnership with Donside Community Church. The Lighthouse Support Centre and some friends who came over from Northern Ireland to help run the week' events. The aims of the week were twofold: to bring the gospel to the community of Tillydrone and to provide something fun for people of all ages.
