IN SCHOOL GROUPS

Five-a-Side Football

Riverbank Football has been somewhat of a challenge at the start of this new school year as we have struggled to get a "core" group together due to various reasons e.g., communications not making it through to the kids that football is on, the weather and other after school groups. We are currently working with the school to sort things out and are putting together a flyer for the school to pass onto the kids in order to grow the number of kids coming along to football.

Riverbank SU

After a rocky start to this school year where we saw very few children come along, we are now seeing a steady group of 25-30 in attendance each week. Riverbank SU is a great feeder into the other various groups and activities run such as Radiate. We have had a regular influx of boys to this year's SU group. something we have never really seen before. It is a good group of kids who are very eager to come along and learn about the Bible and spend time with each other in a relaxed environment.

Northfield Academy SU

Northfield Academy SU group continues to go well. We have seen a steady number of 7 to 10 teenagers coming along each week. It is very much a relaxed and relational group where the teenagers are becoming more and more comfortable with each other, engaging well with the short talks, currently 'The Fruits of the Spirit', and enjoying chilling out with each other in a safe and comfortable setting.

Everyone participated well in the various activities put on by the Compass Centre team and the discussion sessions around the topic of 'What is the Gospel'. The sessions led to some deep questions




and discussions. The weekend was a huge success and already the vouna people are talking about Youth Weekend Away 2024.

Radiate

Radiate (P3 - P7) continues to go really well and has very much been a real highlight of the youth-work in Tillydrone recently. We have a great group of around 16 to 20 children from P3-P7 each week. Over the past few months, we have been going through the book of Genesis. This has gone very well with a high level of engagement from the children, both in the discussions and their craft sessions where

they have been puttingtogether their own book of Genesis and what we have been looking at. Illuminate





past weeks we have been studying the question "Who is Jesus?". We have seen a real interest in the study from a lot of our young people with some deep and penetrating questions being raised and discussed.

One challenge we are facing with this group is a lack of volunteers to man and supervise the group. We are endeavouring to identify further volunteers with the issue being a main point of prayer for us.

Friday Night Youth Drop-In

After a sharp drop in the numbers of young people attending the Drop-in over the summer, we now have around 15 to 20 teenagers coming along regularly once a fortnight on a Friday night. We feel that with the onset of the darker nights, attendance will increase further.

We have had good engagement with the teenagers who have been coming along and some of them have started coming along to some of the other groups that are run. We are continuing to determine and plan how best to develop the Drop-in further. with the refurbished Lighthouse Support Centre and Donside Community Church building in Pennan Road being an integral part of that planning.

One-to-One Support

Our weekly one-to-one support sessions with some of our young people continue to go well and are very much seen as an important part of the vouth-work in Tillydrone. Trust between the voung people and volunteers has taken time to build but they obviously do appreciate the availability of a safe space where they can openly discuss anything which they feel the need to discuss and share. It also provides an opportunity for those young people who are Christians to share and discuss their faith and beliefs with older Christians.

PANNA Cage Football

Sadly, the use of our PANNA Cage Football has been somewhat sporadic this year, due primarily to the unpredictability of the weather over the summer. The Cage has now been mothballed for the winter and we hope and pray for a better season in 2024.
